Hardly had we returned to school when the OFSTED inspectors arrived. They concluded:


2008 GCSE Results

- * 100% of pupils with 5 A* C grades.
- * 42% of pupils with A*/A grades.
- * 10 out of 82 pupils achieved 9 or more A*/A grades.
- * 24 out of 82 pupils achieved 5 or more A*/A grades.
- * 54% of our pupils from the 14s have been awarded A*/A grades in Science under the new GCSE Science arrangement. In addition, 2 pupils from our 14s (Year 10) have been awarded A* grades early in Russian and Spanish.

Under 13s football team – played 6 and won 6. Definitely a flying start. (Details to follow.)


2004–2005 – Crystal Palace and Fulham together in the Premiership.
