History Trip to Germany



During the Easter holidays the History department took twenty-nine senior pupils to Germany. We visited Munich, Nuremburg, Weimar and Berlin. Students were able to experience the settings of some of Germany's most important historic events from the Munich Putsch to the collapse of the Berlin Wall. Highlights included tracing the steps of Hitler's attempted revolt, standing at the spot where he made many of his speeches during the Nuremburg rallies, a visit to the concentration camp at Buchenwald, and an evening visit to the roof of the newly refurbished Reichstag in Berlin.
